OUR PROGRAM

Provides intervention and education via respite camps, mental health education, activity days and mental health education programs.

OUR PHILOSOPHY

We believe all children who are affected by parents or other family members with a mental illness deserve to be supported, to be valued and to reach their potential.

THE PRESENT

Kookaburra Kids has been supporting our children living in families affected by mental illness for 15 years.

Over the past year the organisation has experienced tremendous growth in client numbers. Currently over 1,300 children in NSW and ACT access our program with new referrals coming in each week.

Currently we have three offices across NSW and ACT, with strong presences in the Sydney, Sutherland Shire, Western Sydney, Illawarra and Canberra regions.

To sum up; we are supporting more children, in more locations, and more effectively and efficiently, than ever before.

THE FUTURE

Expansion of Kookaburra Kids' reach and impact is the key strategy over the next five years.

Kookaburra Kids has an implementation plan to launch the program nationally, including state-based offices in NT, QLD in 2017-2018 and VIC, SA and WA in 2018-2020.

MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAIR and CEO

This year, Kookaburra Kids celebrates 15 years of supporting children living in families affected by mental illness. From the beginning in 2002, Kookaburra Kids has grown year on year into the organisation we are today, with over 1300 children registered to the Kookaburra Kids program.

As the organisation continues to grow we stay committed to our mission of ensuring all children who have a parent or other family member with a mental illness are supported, valued and provided the opportunity to strive toward their potential.

The 2016-2017 year saw some great achievements and successes for Kookaburra Kids and the children we support including:

- The launch of the Kookaburra Kids Program for Serving and Ex-Serving ADF Families
- The opening of our first interstate office in Australian Capital Territory
- The launch of Taking Flight
- Increased revenue up 44.5% on last year
- The strengthening of our partnership program
- The launch of a regular giving campaign – the Coffee Cup Challenge
- Three successful fundraising events
- 62% increase in child referrals
- 48% increase in volunteer registrations
- The delivery of 10 camps and a 91% increase to 21 activity days
- 3 new staff members joined the Kookaburra team
- The appointment of Allan Sparkes CV, OAM, VA as a proud Kookaburra Kids Ambassador

A highlight of the year was the launch of our two new and exciting programs.

In 2016, Kookaburra Kids was granted Government funding from the Department of Veterans' Affairs to replicate our renowned program and deliver it to children from serving and ex-serving Australian Defence Force families affected by mental illness.

The Defence-specific program was launched in Canberra at Parliament House in March 2017, receiving Government recognition and bi-partisan support. Since the launch, Kookaburra Kids has commenced with the state-by-state

rollout of the program, opening our first interstate office in Canberra and holding the first Defence Program camp in June. The program will be progressively rolled out across Australia over the next five years.

Launched in April 2017, Taking Flight grew from the pilot Kookaburra Kids program "Girls Taking Flight", making it available for any graduating Kookaburra Kid. Taking Flight extends our support of young adults beyond the existing camp program, focusing on assisting them to navigate the transition from high school to employment or tertiary study.

As ever, we will continue to build our understanding of the unique needs and challenges faced by children who have a parent with a mental illness and develop our programs accordingly.

Over the coming years Kookaburra Kids will continue its journey, transitioning from a NSW based program to a program available nationally. As we embark on this national path, we remain committed to ensuring our programs are delivered with the passion and integrity we are so proud of. A clinical team will be established in 2017 to conduct research and program evaluation to ensure our programs remain appropriate and effective in supporting children who have a family member with a mental illness.

Finally, we would like to take this time to acknowledge the contribution and important role of our tireless community of supporters. Our dedicated staff, Board directors, ambassadors, patrons, volunteers, community supporters and partners continue to work together to ensure we are able to provide this much-needed support to children living in families affected by mental illness.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

ITS BEEN A BUSY YEAR!

In keeping with our strategic plan, whilst continuing to support our existing programs and families, Kookaburra Kids launched two new programs, Taking Flight and the Kookaburra Kids Program for Serving and Ex-Serving ADF Families. The new programs complement our existing camp and activity day programs, helping us to continue to work towards supporting all children living in families affected by mental illness.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS 16/17

We are committed to delivering a program that builds resilience, gives hope and provides kids with the opportunity to learn about mental illness and reach their potential.

WE DELIVERED 10 KOOKABURRA KIDS CAMPS

Kookaburra Kids camps are FREE and provide children living in families affected by mental illness with an essential break from their carer role and the challenges they face at home, as well as the chance to participate in a range of fun, confidence-building activities, such as canoeing, archery, giant swings, go-karts and much more.

An important component of the Kookaburra Kids camp is Chat Group. Chat Group takes place each day, facilitated by our team of trained volunteer leaders. It provides an opportunity to learn about mental illness and how it affects the person who is ill and their family. Children can share their experiences and are supported to build and improve their coping skills and resilience.

A camp counsellor (Clinical Consultant) oversees the Chat Group program and is responsible for the wellbeing of the children and volunteers.

Kookaburra Kids camp also provides the children with an opportunity to form new friendships with kids who are going through similar situations. Many friendships have been started or strengthened over the past year.

What a year for activity days! Activity days are important to Kookaburra Kids' children, giving them opportunities to reconnect with each other, Kookaburra Kids staff and volunteers in between camps.

In 2016, Kookaburra Kids was granted Government funding to replicate its successful program and deliver it to serving and ex-serving Australian Defence Force families.

The program, which has now commenced with its first camp in NSW, will roll out nationally over the next five years. An office has been open in the ACT and staff have been employed to work directly with this target group.

This recognition of our program within Government, along with bi-partisan support, has significantly raised Kookaburra Kids' profile, allowing us to continue to work towards our mission of supporting all children living in families affected by mental illness.

This program has been funded by the Australian Government.

TAKING FLIGHT

The Taking Flight program supports Kookaburra Kids youth in their final years of, or who have recently finished high school, supporting them to enter tertiary education or the workforce. We recognise that not all of our clients have the necessary family support or role models, access to resources or knowledge, exposure to a range of industries/workplaces, or the confidence to make informed educational and employment choices. The program aims to bridge the employability gap, alleviate barriers to employment or tertiary education, build skill capabilities and empower the young people to achieve job success and satisfaction.

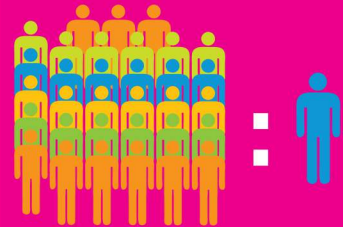

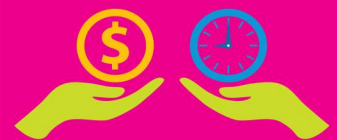

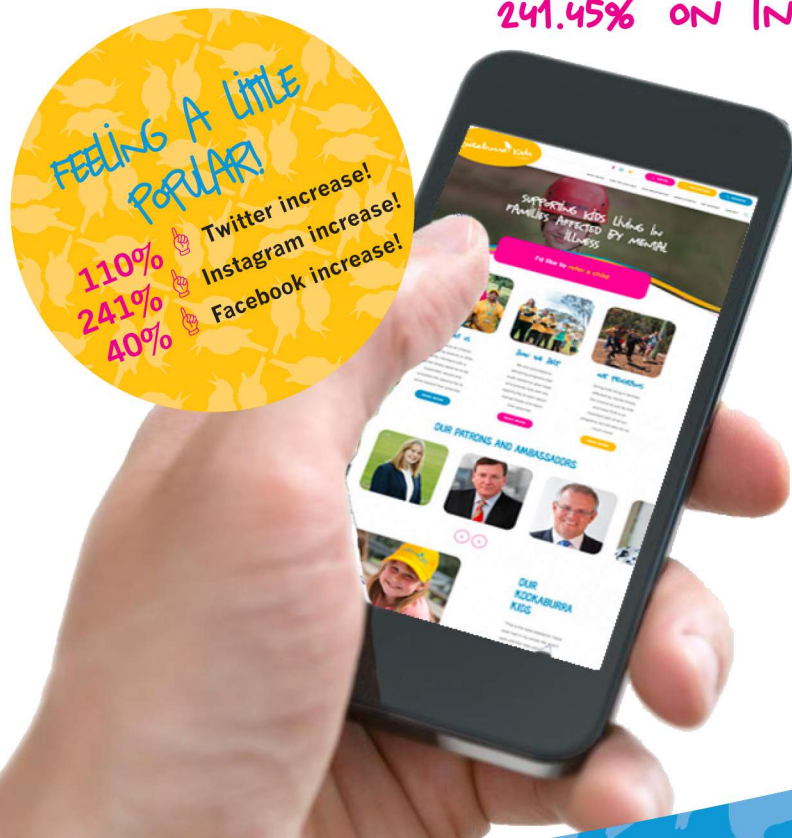
SOCIAL MEDIA

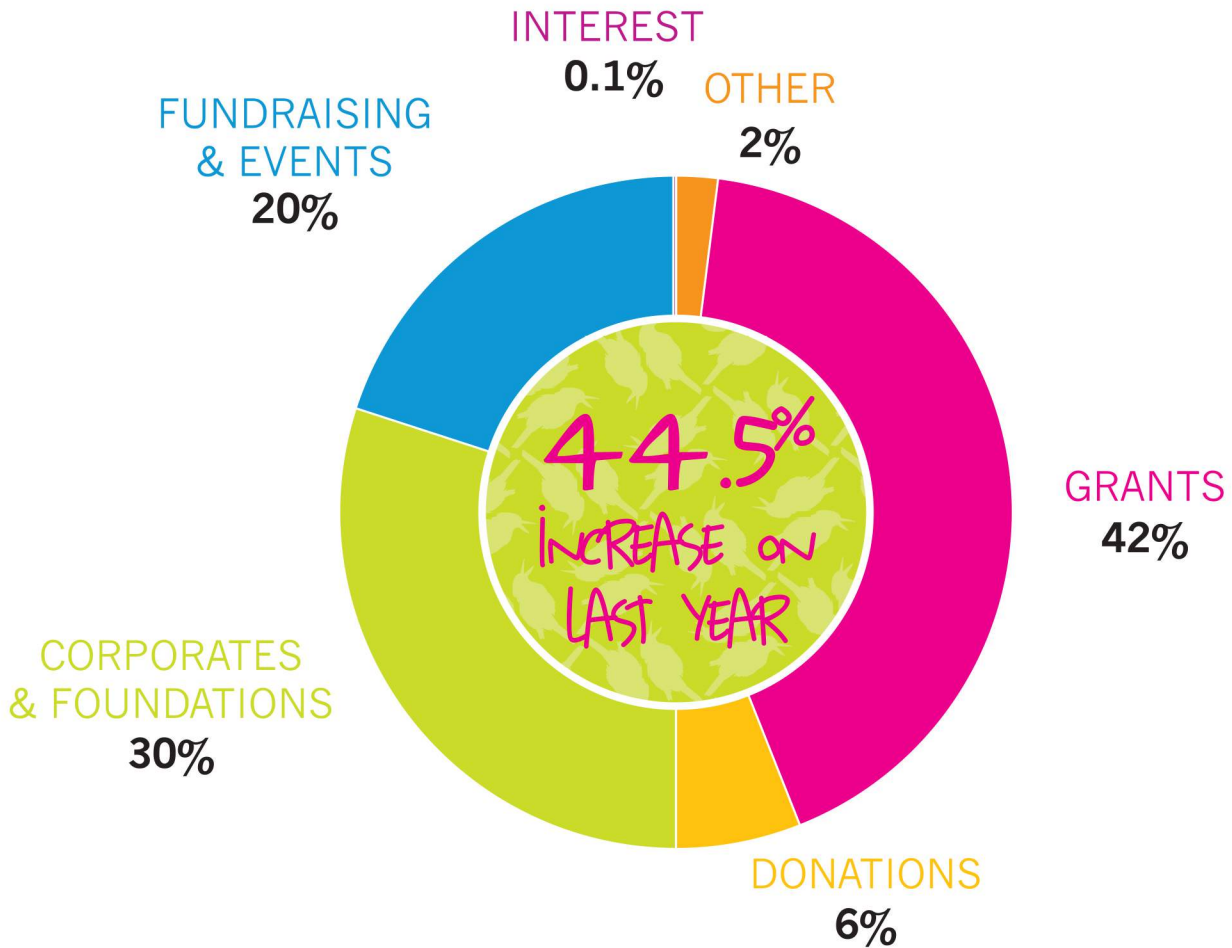
